

Redland Museum

Description of key features of museum- what are its unique features? What is significant in its collection?

The Redland Museum was officially opened in 1970. The initial concept was the result of great generosity from the Rotary Club of Cleveland and its members. The Museum was developed as a Social History Museum for the Redland Shire since 1842. There are over 60 active volunteers who spend more than 1,000 hours per month running the Museum. The membership base for the Museum is growing and exceeds 250 people. The Museum has an internal display area of 1,450 square metres housing a remarkable and diversified collection of historically significant items. There are currently about 13,000 items. The working Blacksmith's shop is unique. There are several building and display projects on the drawing board. One significant feature is the new organisational arrangement being put in place. The Management Committee will govern the organisation with day to day management and work being performed by sub committees and work groups. Our goal is to be the best regional museum in Australia and with the magnificent support of our members and the local community this will be achieved.
